School Timings

For Junior, Middle, and Senior School children, the School gates will close promptly at 7:55 am. Arriving late for school is not permissible.

*Timings are subject to change based on notifications from the Government concerning severe cold, pollution, and heatwaves.

Please note that when visiting the school for any reason, it is compulsory to carry the parent ID card.

Written permission from the Director /Principal is required for any student to leave the premises.

In the event of a medical emergency, the Medical Officer, Class Teacher or Principal, may contact parents and request that they take their child home.

Parents are not permitted to take their child home before the scheduled end of the school day.

a. Late Arrival in School

To foster a culture of punctuality, students who arrive late without a valid explanation will not be allowed to enter the school premises.

Repeated instances of late arrival will result in disciplinary action being taken against the student. Specifically, students who arrive late on more than three occasions in a term will not be permitted to attend classes on the fourth occurrence.

Evaluation System and Assessments

Regular Academics Update: Class PS to XII

Weekly Work Plans consist of the teaching lessons, activities, projects, celebrations and important events.

a. CLASS Pre School to IV:

- The academic year is divided into three Cycles, and the child's progress is evaluated based on day-to-day performance held during school hours. Assessments based on themes are conducted in various ways, such as written assessments through worksheets and notebooks, and oral assessments through classroom discussions.

b. CLASS V to VIII:

40% weightage of Term 1 (Periodic Assessment I + Mid Term)
60% weightage of Term 2 (Periodic Assessment II + Final Term)

- Final Term 80 Marks Assessment
- Mid Term 80 Marks Assessment
- PA I & II 50 Marks Assessment each
- Internal Assessment: 10 Marks Assessment

Internal Assessment: Subject Enrichment Activities, notebook maintenance, attendance, are evaluated. All students will be assessed on discipline which will be based on the factors like attendance, sincerity, behaviour, values, tidiness, attitude towards society & Nation, abiding by the rules & regulations.

c. CLASS IX:

10% weightage of Periodic Assessment, 10% of Midterm, & 80% of Final Term

- Final Term 80 Marks Assessment
- Mid Term 80 Marks Assessment
- PA I & II 50 Marks Assessment each
- Internal Assessment: 10 Marks Assessment

Internal Assessment: Subject Enrichment Activities, notebook maintenance, attendance, are evaluated. All students will be assessed on discipline which will be based on the factors like attendance, sincerity, behaviour, values, tidiness, attitude towards society & Nation, abiding by the rules & regulations.

d. CLASS XI:

10% weightage of Unit Test I + Unit Test II,
40% weightage of Mid-Term & 50% weightage of Final Term

- Final-Term 100 Marks Assessment
- Mid-Term 80 Marks Assessment
- Unit Test-I & II 50 Marks Assessment each

e. Class X & XII

It is mandatory to score at least 40% marks in all the Assessments including the Pre Boards and maintain a minimum of 75% attendance to receive the admit card.

- Pre Board-I 100 Marks Assessment (Theory & Practical)
- Pre Board-II 80/70 Marks Assessment (Theory) subject to availability of time
- Mid Term 100 Marks Assessment (Theory & Practical)
- Unit Test-I 50 Marks Assessment

Assessment Guidelines

- Any student found using unfair means during any test or assessment will be disqualified, and may even face rustication from the school.
- The submission of Class-work, Home-work, Projects, and Assignments is compulsory, as they form a part of the regular assessment.
- To achieve the desired standards as per CBSE guidelines, it is crucial to maintain regular attendance, submit assignments on time, and make sustained efforts towards academic excellence.
- The datesheet and syllabus for tests and assessments are uploaded on the school portal approximately 15 days before their commencement.
- Progress reports are provided to parents following each round of assessments during Parent-Teacher Meetings.

Promotion Criteria

- For classes Pre-School to VIII, students are typically not detained but if a child fails in the examination of class V to VIII, he/she shall be granted the opportunity for Re-examination. In Re-examination if a student of class V to VIII is not eligible to pass and be promoted, they will be placed in the category of "Essential Repeater". Essential Repeater will be held back in the same class during the next session.
- However, if a student's attendance falls below 75% or they struggle with the syllabus, leading to poor grades in assessments, they may be retained in the same class at the discretion of school authorities.
- Classes IX to XII: As per CBSE Guidelines.
- In order to be promoted, the student must obtain a minimum of 40% marks in each theory and practical subject separately, along with maintaining a minimum attendance of 75%.

Parent-Teacher Meetings & Interactions

- Both online (via Google Meet) and physical Parent-Teacher meetings are held regularly to discuss your child's progress with their teacher. Attendance is mandatory for parents.
- The dates for Parent Teacher Meetings will be communicated to parents in advance via email, or the Student/Parent Portal.
- If parents wish to meet with a teacher outside of the scheduled PTM, they must seek a prior appointment through the official email ID of the Class Teacher.
- We encourage parents to attend all Parent Teacher Meetings as they are an important way to stay updated about their child's progress.

Appointments with the Principal/ Class Teacher

- Parents are requested to refrain from disturbing classes during school hours or meeting teachers without prior appointments.
- The school has designated Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 2:15 pm to 3:00 pm for meeting teachers, while the Pre-Primary Wing, Uditayan is open for appointments on the first and third Saturdays of the month, with prior appointment.
- To make an appointment, parents should send a request to the Class Teacher on their official email ID at least one working day in advance, and the response will be reverted on the mail.
- To meet the Principal, parents may obtain an appointment through the School reception either by emailing at office@mbiis.in or the class teacher's official email ID.

Attendance, Absence & Leave

- Ensuring your child's safety is our top priority. We request that you do not take your child out of school during school hours unless it is an emergency, and only with permission from the school authorities.
- For promotion, the CBSE guidelines require a minimum attendance of 75% for the entire academic year.
- Unless there is an illness, students are not granted leave outside the regular vacation period.
- In case of absence due to medical reasons, the class teacher will record the absence only on the receipt of a valid medical certificate from a certified medical practitioner.
- Punctuality is important, and if your child was absent on the previous day, please send a justification email to the class teacher on her official email id.
- Each absence will be meticulously recorded in the Attendance Register. Students arriving after the designated class attendance time will receive a late remark. Accumulation of three late remarks will result in penalties and disciplinary action against the student.
- Continuous absence from school for 10 days without permission will lead to the removal of a student's name from the school register. To seek re-admission, parents must pay re-admission fees, and it is limited to two times in a year. However, re-admission is not allowed one month before the start of the Annual Assessment. It is important to ensure regular attendance to avoid such consequences.
- Students with valid reasons for being unable to complete written assessments may qualify for a retest; however, they will not be eligible for school badges or other honors. In the case of absence due to serious illness, an application for leave along with a medical report from a certified medical practitioner must be submitted to the Principal.
- If a student fails to attend any test, examination, practical, project work, etc. without a valid reason, they will be marked as absent for that assessment, and no retest or re-examination will be arranged.
- Additionally, if your child has had an infectious or contagious disease and is returning to school, he/she must provide a fitness certificate from a certified medical practitioner confirming that it is safe for him/her to attend school.

Students suffering from the following diseases must observe the prescribed period of quarantine before returning to class:

ID Card

- Due to increased security measures, it is mandatory for all students to carry their ID card to school every day, as it is an essential part of the school uniform.
- Students are required to wear their ID cards during school hours and while commuting to and from school.
- At the beginning of each new academic session, students must complete the ID card proforma.

- If a student loses their ID card or if any information on the card needs to be changed, such as a change of address, a form for issuing a duplicate ID card can be submitted at the Front Office with a fine of Rs 100/-.
- Additionally, parents will also be issued ID cards for entry into the school.

Payment of Fees

- Payment of the school fee is due within the first 15 days of every month. Please ensure timely payment to avoid late charges, which will be applicable from the 15th of the fee-paying month. Parents are expected to pay school dues on time.
- For a child admitted after the start of term, fees will be charged for the entire academic session.

Note: The school office operates during vacations, including all Saturdays throughout the year, except for gazetted holidays.

Withdrawal Policy

If a parent wishes to withdraw his/her ward's admission from the school:

- In the event that withdrawal from the school becomes necessary, the parent/legal guardian is required to submit an application for withdrawal and obtain approval from the Principal. Additionally, they must settle one month's fees, covering tuition fees, transport fees, and LSP charges, starting from the 1st day of the month following the withdrawal request.
- A clear notice of one calendar month in writing must be paid, else the parent will be liable to pay the fee and other charges for the facilities for the following month. Failure to provide the requisite notice will result in payment of Fees for the full succeeding month.
- It's important for parents to be aware of the deadlines and procedures for withdrawing their children from school. By submitting the application before the deadline, they can avoid any additional fees or charges.
- Clearing all outstanding fees and obtaining clearance from all school departments, including the library, is mandatory at the time of withdrawal.
- It's also important for students to settle all outstanding dues before they can receive their transfer certificates. This ensures that the school has received all payments for services provided and helps maintain financial accountability.

End of Session:

- At the end of the academic session, if a parent intends to withdraw their child before the start of the new session, they must apply before 31 March. Failure to do so will require the parent to pay the fees for the month of April of the new academic session, as well as any other outstanding dues owed to the school.
- When withdrawing a student, they must return their identity card/Bus Pass, and obtain a no dues certificate. Transfer certificates will not be issued until all outstanding dues have been

settled.

Issue of Transfer Certificate and other documents

If parents request for a Transfer Certificate (TC) for their child, they must pay the applicable fees as per withdrawal policy. Transfer Certificates will be issued within fifteen working days, only after all necessary formalities have been completed by the school and Department of Education who counter signs the TC.

- Certificates and other documents such as Recommendation Letters, Bonafide Certificates, Fee Payment Certificates, and any other documents required by parents, will be given upon written request.
- In the event of a lost Transfer Certificate, a duplicate copy will only be issued upon submission of an affidavit stating the loss of the document, a copy of the FIR, and a fee of Rs. 500/- at the School Office.
- Duplicate/Subsequent copies of Bonafide Certificates and Fee Payment Certificates will be issued on payment of Rs. 500/- for each additional copy during an academic session.

Tracksuit: Navy blue with House colours. To be worn with House T-shirt and white shoes on LSP Days in winter.

(b) Light Blue/Black turbans will be the headgear for Sikh boys.

(c) Friday: All will be dressed in the white uniform with similar specifications but white socks & white shoes.

(c) School Tie/Scarf is compulsory for special functions and with winter uniform.

(d) Fine of Rs. 100/- will be imposed if students do not come in proper uniform of the day to school.

(e) Names should be tagged on blazers & sweaters.

(f) Black Gola shoes from Monday to Saturday except on the days of the LSP & Friday

Books

Students are required to use notebooks/exercise books of standard design, bearing the name of the school.

Lunch

- Please ensure that your child comes to school with a wholesome packed lunch. The school authorities cannot collect or distribute lunch packets sent later in the day. Please avoid sending them.
- Sending Lunch or water bottles later in the day is strictly prohibited due to security reasons .
- Please ensure that your child carries a proper one liter water bottle to school. Improvised and unhygienic bottles will not be permitted.
- Refrain from sending plastic lunch boxes and water bottles to school.

Helping Your Child do Better at School

- Kindly read and explain the relevant content of this e-handbook to your child.
- It is crucial to ensure that your child devotes sufficient time to completing their assignments and revising lessons on a daily basis at home.
- We kindly request your support in maintaining a supportive, caring and disciplined environment in school.
- In cases where a student's conduct is harmful to others, the school may have to resort to penalties such as in-school or out-of-school suspension, or even expulsion.
- However, this is only a last resort after all other measures have failed to improve the child's behaviour, and the parent will be fully informed.
- By cooperating with us and adhering to these guidelines, you can significantly contribute to your child's academic progress.
- If you have any suggestions or concerns, please communicate them via a letter or email addressed to the Principal.

Volunteering for School Activities

If you possess a unique ability, expertise, or even some additional free time, you might want to contemplate becoming a volunteer participant in the formal or extracurricular programs offered by the school. The possibilities are vast, ranging from teaching classes, giving lectures, coaching sports, overseeing dramatics, music, club activities, organising excursions, and more. Communicating with Manava Bharati

- It is mandatory for all parents to visit the School Website at www.mbiis.in on a daily basis to keep up with crucial circulars, work plans, notices, and posted school events.
- The school has created a **secure Email Id** within the **MBIIS GSuite** for each student. (Google Apps is also called G-Suite which is a suite of cloud computing.)
- Access to online classes is restricted to the G Suite School Official email ID exclusively. No other email ID will be permitted for this purpose. When communicating with the Class Teacher, it is mandatory to use the G Suite School Official email ID.
- It's essential to note that this is the Official School ID and should not be used for personal purposes. If a student violates the code of conduct or misuses their account, their official G-Suite ID will be suspended.
- Before contacting the school by phone, we advise you to refer to the MBIIS Parent-Student website www.mbiis.in for details, Date Sheets, and other circulars.
- The school employs digital communication through the MBIIS Parent-Student Portal to distribute information, including the latest updates, homework assignments, notices, and announcements, enabling you to access them from anywhere at any time, while also reducing paper waste and aiding in our efforts to combat climate change.
- Please ensure that your current contact information, including mobile number and email address, is always up-to-date with the school administration.
- Important messages, including daily attendance records, are communicated to parents through School portal or email.

Safety of Belongings

- For easy identification of lost property, kindly label all of your child's belongings with his/her name and class. While we will make every effort to locate lost items.
- It is important to note that the school cannot be held responsible for any losses. Additionally, please refrain from providing your child with excessive pocket money.
- It is strictly prohibited to offer gifts or rewards to teachers or staff.
- Lastly, please discourage your child from bringing valuable items such as expensive watches, fountain pens, laptops, calculators, or jewelry to school.
- In case of any loss, we will do our best to locate the item, but the school cannot accept any responsibility for the loss.

Traveling Between Home and School

- We kindly request that you personally accompany your child to and from the designated bus stop, and carry the parent ID card with you.
- Please note that if students from Nursery to Class IV are not received at the bus stop on time, they will be brought back to the school, and parents will need to pick them up from the school.
- Our school buses prioritize safety, are well maintained and child-friendly. Each bus is equipped with a well-trained driver, an attendant, cameras with GPS trackers and a first aid box to ensure the safety of the children. Additionally, teachers accompany the children during their bus journey, ensuring their well-being throughout.
- While the school takes adequate precautions to prevent transportation-related accidents or injuries, it cannot be held liable for any resulting damages or injuries.
- The government has prohibited the use of vans that are not authorised for the transportation of school children. Please refrain from using such illegal modes of transport to ensure the safety of your child. However, carpooling is encouraged.
- All students are required to wear their school ID card when boarding the bus and throughout the return journey. Students are prohibited from traveling on the school buses without a valid ID card.
- It is imperative that students keep all parts of their body inside the bus at all times and refrain from throwing any object inside or outside the bus during the journey. Shrieking or shouting is strictly prohibited.
- Any misconduct towards the bus driver, conductor, bus teacher, or fellow students will be treated as a serious offense and may result in suspension from both school and bus services.
- Parents are not permitted to enter the school bus under any circumstances, nor should they argue with the bus teacher, driver, or conductor.
- Bus stops are predetermined at the beginning of the session, but the school reserves the right to create, cancel, or relocate a particular bus stop as needed during the session.
- When children go on excursions, visits, tours, picnics, etc., they should be dropped off and picked up only by their parents from the school.
- In the event of withdrawing a child from the bus service during the session, one month's written notice is mandatory. However, withdrawal is not permitted if transport points were availed for preschool admission. Additionally, bus withdrawal requests will not be accepted during the fourth quarter of the session.
- Bus fees are applicable for eleven months, with no fee payable for the month of June.
- It is mandatory for parents to carry a "Parent ID Card" while visiting the school or picking up their child from the school or school transport.

Private / Self - Transport

- The school prohibits students from driving two or four wheeler vehicles to and from school, even if they possess a valid driving license. Vehicles of this nature are not allowed to be parked inside or outside the school premises. The school will take strict action against any such vehicle found parked outside the premises.
- Parents are responsible for ensuring that the drivers of private vehicles that transport their children to and from school have the required character and antecedent verification report from the police authorities. Parents must also have a copy of the driver's license, Aadhar Card, and Police Verification Certificate. The school reserves the right to ask for these documents at

any time. If the parent fails to submit the documents, the private van will not be allowed.

- Children must be picked up from school by their parents, van drivers, or car drivers at their scheduled departure time. The school will not take responsibility for any child left behind after the scheduled departure time by any of the aforementioned persons.
- We also advise against allowing underage students to drive cars or two-wheelers, as this is not only dangerous but also a punishable offense.

Mobile Phones and Electronic Gadgets

- The school has a strict policy against students bringing mobile phones to school, with the exception of students in classes XI and XII. However, even these students are required to deposit their mobile phones with either their class teacher or subject teacher upon entering the campus and can be collected on their way out of the school.
- According to CBSE regulations, bringing mobile phones to school is prohibited, and confiscated devices will not be returned to parents. Additionally, electronic watches and other electronic gadgets are not permitted on school premises. Students found with a mobile phone after initial confiscation may face suspension in addition to the device being seized.
- It is emphasized that unsupervised use of any electronic communication device is strictly prohibited on school premises as directed by CBSE. Students are forbidden from bringing cigarettes, e-cigarettes, e-hookah, deodorants/perfumes, explosive material/crackers, and sharp tools/knives to school. Parents are encouraged to check their children's bags before they depart for school.

Counselor and Special Educator

- The School Counselors actively engage with students, teachers, and parents to provide counseling on various issues and concerns. They may offer recommendations and educate parents on mental health issues, learning disabilities, and behavioural problems.
- The Counselors also provide career guidance and help students identify their strengths. They visit classrooms to discuss study skills, social skills, academic difficulties, and bullying. In addition, they conduct individual sessions with students who are facing such difficulties.
- The school also has Special Educators to help children with special needs integrate into classes and provide remedial sessions during school hours to address their specific requirements.
- Parents can schedule an appointment to meet with the School Counsellor or Special Educator between 2:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. on any working Tuesday or Friday via an official email to the Class Teacher.

- To enhance the learning outcomes of students, the School has upgraded all its classrooms with the latest technology, introducing modern teaching techniques aided by technology. The school campus is also wifi-enabled, allowing students and teachers to remain connected at all times.
- Smart classes are equipped with advanced technology, such as smartboards, laptops/computers, internet connectivity, projectors, amplifiers, speakers, podium, microphones, and more.
- These classes are a perfect substitute for typical in-campus learning in this age of digitalization.
- The teachers continue the use of technology and revolutionize the ways of teaching and learning, online classes are accepted as an alternative classroom setting for students across all age groups.

Beyond the Classroom

- We offer exceptional facilities to nurture the creativity of our students and provide opportunities for individual and group activities that cater to every child's interests.
- We take pride in acknowledging the achievements of our students in all aspects of life, and we encourage them to form clubs and societies, explore diverse materials, and interact with their peers.

- Since this is a screening exercise and not a diagnostic, parents are encouraged to seek the opinion of their family physician or doctor for further evaluation.

The mantra is a prayer for guidance and protection, asking for the Divine to lead us from ignorance and falsehood towards truth and knowledge. It also asks for guidance from darkness towards light, from mortality towards immortality, and ultimately towards spiritual enlightenment. The reference to Rudra, an ancient Hindu deity associated with destruction and transformation, is a symbol of the transformative power of the Divine that can lead us towards our ultimate goal. The prayer seeks protection in the southern face of Rudra, which is considered a place of power and protection in Hindu tradition.

It is a reminder to act with kindness, love, and respect towards all beings, whether humans or animals, and to promote harmony, peace, and happiness in the world.
